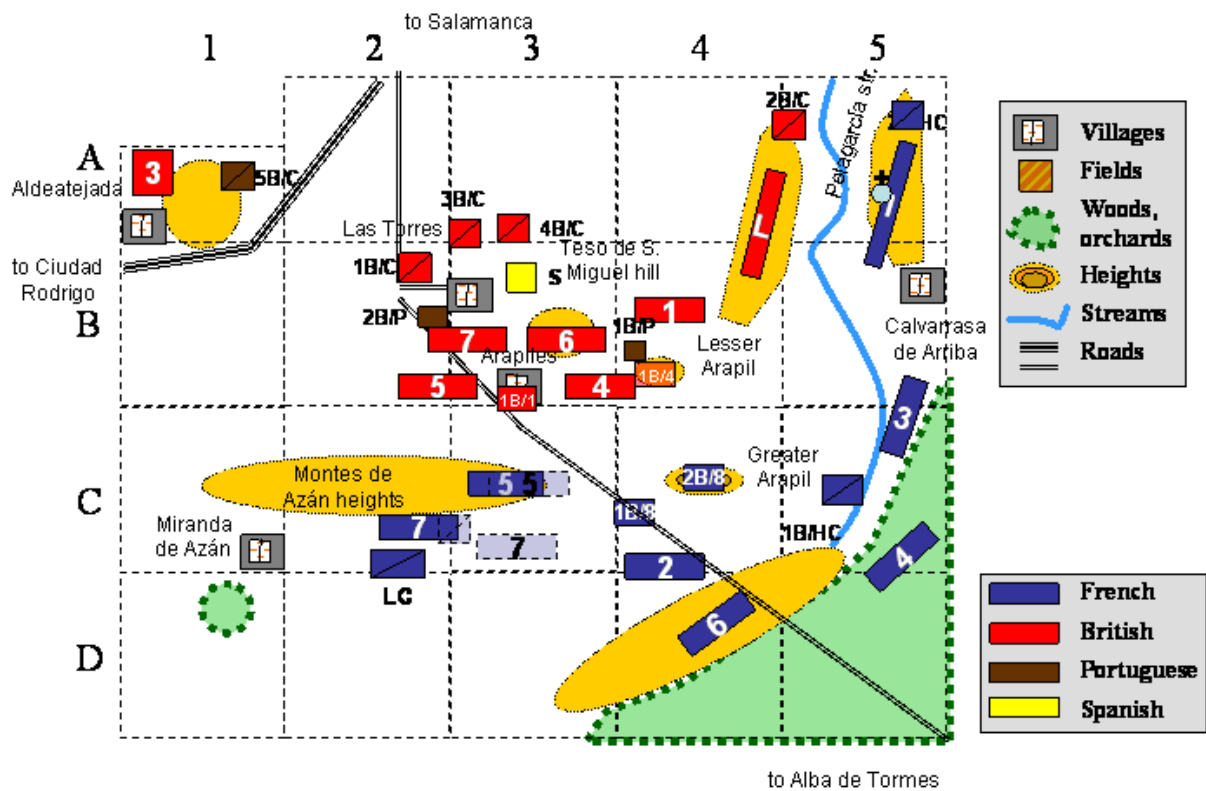


# The Battle of Los Arapiles or Salamanca, 22<sup>nd</sup> July 1812

The British army commanded by Wellington crossed the Spanish frontier in June 1812. After entering in Salamanca, Wellington and Marmont, C-i-C of the French *Armée de Portugal*, indulged in a series of marches and counter-marches between the Tormes and Duero rivers during July. Both commanders were anxious to try a contest and lastly both armies crossed to south of the Tormes occupying the two more prominent features, *los Hermanitos o Arapiles* (the lesser Arapil by the British and the Great Arapil by the French). Marmont tried to cut the supposed retreat of Wellington towards Ciudad Rodrigo, but the manoeuvre was badly carried out by his subordinates and the British general suddenly attacked the overextended French.

## 1 MAP OF THE BATTLEFIELD OF SALAMANCA

### Salamanca (Los Arapiles) July 22, 1812



#### MAP NOTES

- 1.1 The buildings of Arapiles village have a "+2" combat modifier.
- 1.2 Cavalry and artillery treat woods as rough ground for movement purposes, unless they were on a road or in limbered/column/march column formation.
- 1.3 All water is fordable for infantry and cavalry in any formation but artillery must cross limbered or in march column formation.
- 1.4 The terrain squares are 40x40 cm (15.7"x15.7")

Divisional foot batteries (marked \*) were assigned by Wellington for direct fire support to Infantry and Cavalry units and deployed accordingly (See the labels). A maximum of one divisional battery may be maintained in reserve. Horse artillery batteries are commanded as usual. Framingham can command any battery in the army.

Divisional foot batteries (marked \*) must be used primarily for direct fire support to their assigned divisions. Horse and Reserve Artillery batteries are commanded as usual. Tirlett can command any battery in the army.

## 4 SPECIAL RULES FOR SALAMANCA

### 4.1 Game Length

1300- 2200 h (19 turns)

Both British and French get 5 free-rolls. British deploy first. The French have the initiative and are the first side.

### 4.2 French deployment

The map shows the situation after Marmont initiated his westwards movement in order to cut the supposed British retreat towards Ciudad-Rodrigo. To simulate the unsupported westwards advance of the French 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> divisions, place them in the dotted positions and consider them always out-of-command. In the necessary command control tests for the French 7<sup>th</sup> division, a half-move result is converted into a compulsory westwards half-move and a no-move result into a compulsory westwards full move (the extreme left of the *Montes de Azán* could not be surpassed anyway). In the case of the French 5<sup>th</sup> division, a half-move and a no-move results are respectively converted into a compulsory artillery/skirmish attack or a compulsory artillery attack on the Arapiles village. Marmont could halt these movements by attaching himself to the given divisions.

### 4.3 The Duke of Wellington

Use the optional rule that allows to mark Wellington as 'React' if not moved during his side's movement step.

### 4.4 Marmont is wounded

Additionally to the rule for eliminating Generals attached to routed or dispersed units, each time that Marmont is within 3" of a French unit fired upon by British artillery, carry out an elimination test likewise he was attached to a routed or dispersed unit.

### 4.5 British (and French) independent brigade commanders

The commanders of British cavalry and Portuguese independent brigades were used in a semi-independent tactical way so they are shown in the tabletop. These are:

All these generals must remain continuously attached to their brigades, so their command radius is not printed in the labels (nor counted in the points value of the Army).

Pack and Bradford command two independent infantry Portuguese brigades and are directly subordinated to Wellington as usual.

The British cavalry brigades are independent combat units, so are not automatically marked with a half-move marker when they are beyond the command radius (5") from Cotton (British overall Cavalry commander). Instead, these generals carry out command control tests like ordinary direct commanders when beyond 5" from Cotton.

The French also deploy four brigade generals to carry out semi-independent missions beyond the control radius of their Division commanders:

As above, these French generals must remain continuously attached to their brigades, so their command radius is not printed in the labels (nor counted in the points value of the Army) and behave respecting from their respective Division commanders, like the cavalry British brigade generals respecting from Cotton.

The labels can be glued on an individual General figure or on the command base of the affected unit, as preferred.

**(Optional)** The command radius of the C-i-C's (Wellington and Marmont) has not any effect on these generals.

### 4.6 French cavalry

Marmont was short of cavalry and requisitioned several hundreds of horses from the officials of the *Armée de Portugal* to increase his mounted arm, although these horses were not very adequate for combat nor reconnaissance duties. To show their lesser efficiency, the statistics for the French Light Cavalry units in this Scenario are taken from the years 1813-1815, although the dispersal letter is maintained as 'C'.

In Spain, French dragoons played the role of Heavy Cavalry. Napoleon's Battles does not differentiate French dragoons from other French light cavalry, so a new category has been added to the French unit roster using the statistics for the French Light Cavalry from the years 1805-1812, to show his better performance.

### 4.7 Home rules and such

#### 4.7.1 Cavalry scale and bases

Cavalry bases have 2 figures and their scale is 1/120 and not 1/80. When necessary, multiply the cavalry figures for 3/2 (for example to determine outnumbering in combat) and remove 2 cavalry figures for each 3 losses suffered.

#### 4.7.2 Skirmish fire and divisional batteries

This Scenario uses divisional foot batteries (DA marked \*) as independent combat units. These batteries never can evade and have reduced striking power and mobility.

The effect of these divisional batteries can not be factored into the Fire Factors of Infantry units, and there are several possibilities to take that into account:

- 1) Use an additional "-3" modifier to Infantry Fire Factors, OR
- 2) Modify the Rule 7.3.3 'Resolving Fire' so a 'two losses' result is converted to 'one loss' and a 'one loss' is a miss, OR
- 3) Carry out the infantry fire as usual without any modifier. The resulting losses are not marked on the target unit, but are only used to cause disorder (*Recommended*).

#### 4.7.3 C-i-C ratings (*Optional*)

Do not use "10" as Response number of the C-i-C's but use the values assigned to them as Corps Commanders, *i.e.* the ones printed in the provided labels.

#### 4.7.4 Rallying of units (*Optional*)

Routed units can try to rally without an attached general with an additional '-3' modifier.

### 5. VICTORY POINTS

Using the NB-1 rules. (11.2) the points for terrain objectives are 25% of total points:  $(755+664)*0.25 = 355$  points.

The multiplier for the weaker side (French) is:  $755*1.2/664 = 1.4$ .

The village of Arapiles (C3) is worth 36/50, the village of Miranda (C1) 36/50, the Lesser Arapil (B4) 72/101, the Great Arapil (C4) 72/101,, the El Sierro heights(D4) or the road leading to Alba de Tormes 72/101 and the Aldeatejada (A1) road end leading to Ciudad Rodrigo 72/101 British/French/ victory points each. The village of Arapiles, the Lesser Arapil and the A1 road end are British controlled at the start. The Great Arapil and the El Sierro heights are French controlled.

Using the NB-2 rules, Salamanca is a standard defensive scenario and the 22.4.2 Rule (Assigning objective victory points) is followed. The points of terrain objectives are 10% of total points:  $(755+664)*0.10 = 142$  points. The multiplier for the weaker side (French) is:  $755/(664*0.9)*1.2 = 1.5$

The village of Arapiles (C3) is worth 14/21, the village of Miranda (C1) 14/21, the Lesser Arapil (B4) 28/42, the Great Arapil (C4) 28/42, the El Sierro heights (D4) or the road leading to Alba de Tormes 28/42 and the Aldeatejada (A1) road end leading to Ciudad Rodrigo 28/42 British/French/ victory points each. The village of Arapiles, the Lesser Arapil and the A1 road end are British controlled at the start. The Great Arapil and the El Sierro heights are French controlled.

Be free to calculate the final outcome of the battle following one or both methods OR follow the real method: count all enemy losses in men and guns and take into account hat side remains in possession of the battlefield

### 6 HISTORICAL SALAMANCA

The overextended French Army left was suddenly attacked by the British 3<sup>rd</sup> Division, whereas the British 5<sup>th</sup> Division and the British heavy cavalry fell upon the 5<sup>th</sup> French division. Both attacks resulted in the complete rout of the French left whereas in the center, the French managed to halt the first onslaughts of the British 4<sup>th</sup> division. However, the follow-up of the victorious British advancement occasioned the breaking of the French line, whose disordered units retreated in haste towards Alba de Tormes. The French losses amounted to 14,000 men, 20 guns and two eagles. The British losses were around 6,000 men.

### 3 SALAMANCA UNIT ROSTER

**a.** For infantry in square use the "OT" ("Other") modifier if vs. any infantry. For infantry not in square, use the "OT" modifier if vs. any attacking cavalry, and not in a town, entrenched, or with friendly cavalry in the same combat. For attacking cavalry, use the "OT" modifier vs. infantry or artillery not in square and not in a town, entrenched, or with friendly cavalry in the same combat. Use the current formation modifier in all other combats **b.** The "RSP" ("Response") number is used for all cavalry recall (with a "-2" recall modifier), rallying, and for Infantry attempts to form square (with a "+1" column modifier for all but guerrillas who cannot form square). General "RSP" modifiers are "-1" if Poor, "+1" if Good, "+2" if Excellent. The disorder modifier is "-3". A modified "RSP" number is also the withdrawal modifier **c.** Routs: Infantry and gunners =18", cavalry and limbered artillery = 27".
